- 1. As you've come now through the first four days of creation in Genesis 1, have you been able to learn a bit more about God's wisdom, power, and goodness? What do these verses teach you about God's wisdom, power, and his goodness?
- 2. Read Job 38:1-38. What is the effect that God's questions have on Job? What is the effect they have on you?
- 3. Read Isaiah 40:12-31. How can a meditation upon the power and ability of God bring comfort to those who are fainthearted?
- 4. Read Jeremiah 5:20-25. What is the relation of God setting boundaries for the seas to wicked evildoers and their iniquities?
- 5. Read 2 Peter 3:1-7. Why does Peter bring to remembrance the fact that the earth was formed out of water as he is teaching about coming judgment to scoffers?

Boundary, Bread, Brilliance: Days 2, 3, and 4 of Creation

Initial thoughts:

1. God creates a world (cosmos) of distinction. (Psalm 148)

- 2. God creates, and it is all good.
 - 2 Bad Ideas about the Created World:
 - 1. Creation is morally evil.
 - 2. Creation is itself a moral being. Example, Pope Francis, "Care for our Common Home":

"Everything is related, and we human beings are united as brothers and sisters on a wonderful pilgrimage, woven together by the love God has fore each of his creatures and which also *unites us in fond affection with brother sun*, *sister moon*, *brother river*, *and other earth*."

3. God creates with a direction. (Isaiah 45:18)

I. Day 2: The formation of Earth. (Genesis 1:9-10)

- A. Earth: a dwelling place for life.
- B. Holding back the sea.
 - 1. Teaches God's power. (Psalm 33:6-9)
 - 2. Teaches God's providence. (Job 38:10-11)
 - 3. Teaches God's judgment. (Jeremiah 5:20-25)

II. Day 3: Plants yielding seed, and trees bearing fruit. (Genesis 1:11-13)

- A. What kinds of plants?
 - 1. Grains
 - 2. Fruits
- B. A new creation norm:
 - 1. Fruitfulness

III. Day 4: Lights to govern. (Genesis 1:14-19)

- A. Purposes of the Heavenly Bodies:
 - 1. They shine. (Matthew 13:43)
 - 2. They signify. (Genesis 37:9-10)
 - 3. They determine <u>seasons</u>. (Lev 23:5-6; Col 2:16-17)

- 4. They are <u>clocks</u> for days and years.
- 5. They are sovereign. They rule. (Rev 1:20; Genesis 37:9-10)
- 6. They are associated with <u>angels</u> (Job 38:7) and <u>saints</u>. (Genesis 15:5; Philippians 2:15)
