Envy is a sin that breaks both tables of the law at once; it beings in discontent against God, and ends in injury against man, as we see in Cain. Envious Cain was first discontented with God, by which he broke the first table, and then fell out with his brother and slew him and thus broke the second table. Anger is sometimes soon over, like fire kindled in straw, which is quickly out; but envy is deep rooted, and will not quench its thirst without blood. "Who is able to stand before envy?" Proverbs 27:4. - Thomas Watson, The Ten Commandments

Hebrews 12:24, "...and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel."
