<u>Introduction</u>: chapters 13-15 of the book of Genesis form a literary unit that deals mostly with a single aspect of God's promise to Abraham (Genesis 12:1). That aspect is the LAND (Canaan). Genesis 13-14 serve God's people as encouraging prophecies that predict the blessings that God will give to Abraham's family.
